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Revised North Harbours Local Plan Villa Rosa Urban Design Concept Map PV4

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1.0 Background

- 1.1 The building known as the Villa Rosa and its grounds covering an area of around 2ha was designed by Maltese architect Andrea Vassallo in the 1920s as a house in the Art Nouveau style. (Figure 1).

- 1.2 Town Planning Schemes from the period between the 1920s and the 1980s, indicate additional built development on the site particularly on the eastern portion of the gardens, along the frontage of St. George's Bay, and land to the south was later zoned for development in the 1960s and 1980s. Aerial photographs from after the 1950s reflect the progressive increase in built structures within the site and even more so in the surrounding areas reflecting the allocations in the planning schemes. The approved policy NHPV13 and its associated Urban Design Concept Map PV4 in the North Harbours Local Plan of 2006, set out comprehensive development parameters which are still binding to date.
- 1.3 Since the original policy proposals as consolidated in the approved local plan of 2006, and the approval of various development permissions in the area, the strategic aims for the redevelopment of this site have been evolving over time. An opportunity exists to revise the development planning policy framework to better reflect Government's strategic objectives of strengthening the environmental regulatory safeguards, improve the ecological and geological status of the features of conservation value, open the site for public enjoyment by providing more green open spaces and encouraging the diversion of private sector investment in the tourism and leisure industry towards a higher quality.

2.0 Government Objectives

2.1 On the 10th of October 2024, the Minister informed the Executive Council of the Planning Authority that in terms of Article 41(2) of the Development Planning Act 2016 (Cap. 552), he was requesting the Planning Authority to carry out a partial review of the 2006 North Harbours Local Plan for Paceville (Villa Rosa Site) with the following objectives:

1. To better protect the environmentally sensitive areas, buildings, features, and public access within the site shown on Map (Figure 2);
2. To ensure that development is strictly restricted within the site boundaries shown on Map (Figure 2) and that it does not create unacceptable environmental impacts on the surrounding environmentally sensitive areas, buildings, features and recreational spaces;
3. To re-configure the boundaries of the sub-zones within the site without any changes to the overall site boundary shown on Map (Figure 2) and allocate the land uses within the redefined zones to identify the:
 - a. minimum areas of public open space which must exceed the current allocations in the local plan;
 - b. minimum areas of private open space;
 - c. zones where higher quality hotels shall be allowed;
 - d. zones where residential development shall be allowed;
 - e. zones where a mix of uses (office, retail and catering and other appropriate uses) shall be allowed;
 - f. location of carpark/s;
4. To clearly establish the allowable building heights for each sub-zone, including through the application of the Height Limitation Adjustment Policy for Hotels of 2014;
5. To establish the maximum allowable overall Gross Developable Floorspace (GDF) organised also by sub-zone and by land use;
6. To identify any further impact assessment studies which may be required at project stage, without prejudice to any statutory requirements.

3.0 Public Consultation

- 3.1 Government’s objectives were published for public consultation for a period of six weeks between the 15th of October 2024 and 25th of November 2024. During this consultation period 4318 submissions were received which are included in Appendix 2: Public Submissions on Objectives and Responses of this report.
- 3.2 4,212 submissions included the same text which supported the objectives for the partial local plan review for the Villa Rosa site as these were considered to strike an important balance between promoting sustainable development and ensuring the preservation of environmentally sensitive areas, public access, and community interests. Garnet Investments Ltd as owners of the land commented that they are aligned with the principles of the objectives as published but observed that the local plan policy should enable and regulate both a conventional development as well as a development which aligns with the principles of the Hotel Height Adjustment Policy. However, the said policy should be self-contained and whilst adopting the main principles of the Hotels’ Policy, same should be included in the text of the local plan policy. The revised policy should also

enable the partial roofing over of certain publicly accessible areas and should incentivise and promote the architectural design of the project and enable the Authority a certain degree of flexibility when considering the proposed development.

- 3.3 106 other submissions were received from private individuals, NGOs and Government entities (the Environment and Resources Authority, the Light Pollution Awareness Group and the Astronomical Society of Malta, the St. George's Park Owners Association, the Interdiocesan Commission on the Environment, Flimkien ghal Ambjent Ahjar, the Swieqi and the Pembroke Local Councils, Nature Trust, Din l-Art Helwa and from Partit Nazzjonalista) with 43 being of identical text.
- 3.4 A number of these submissions objected to the development proposed under PA7254/22 or the development approved under PA6072/22, eventually revoked by the Court of Appeal in December 2024. The Bay Street Group requested the extension of the local plan review boundaries so that Baystreet will not remain sandwiched between one of the Villa Rosa Towers and Sqaq Lourdes. The ERA stated that it can support any proposals leading to the removal from the developable area of portions that were previously committed to development as well as the introduction of capping on the potential for future development in the area. It noted that development proposals for the site are still undergoing detailed environmental assessment. Therefore, at this stage, it should be ensured that development on the site takes into account the environmental considerations that may arise from such an assessment.
- 3.5 The issues raised by the public submissions, other than those in support of the review, were:
- i. the lack of transparency about the reason for the review which leads to the conclusion that it is aimed to facilitate the project proposed under PA7254/22
 - ii. the review is an ad-hoc approach to planning when a comprehensive review of all local plans and the SPED is required
 - iii. hotels should not be given a preferential treatment but should still respect residential amenity, scenic or environmentally sensitive sites
 - iv. the lack of a carrying capacity study for more hotel beds in Paceville and at national level
 - v. high rise buildings are not the only hotels which can attract quality tourists. FAR policy for tall buildings needs to be re-hauled
 - vi. the development shall have an adverse impact on the valley and cave and the historic building, shall create a visual intrusion and over-shadowing and pollution, increase traffic and result in over-development. Impact assessments should be

carried out as part of the review process and exceedance of limits should not be allowed

- vii. the local plan should quantify the financial contribution by the developer for mitigating impacts
- viii. the review should be in line with SPED and the Public Domain Act.

4.0 Policy Context

- 4.1 This Partial Review is guided strategically by the Strategic Plan for the Environment and Development (SPED) of 2015 and affects the North Harbours Local Plan of 2006. The Planning Policy on the Use and Applicability of the Floor Area Ratio 2014 and the Hotels Height Limitation Adjustment Policy 2014 are also relevant.

Strategic Plan for the Environment and Development (SPED) 2015

- 4.2 The location, land uses and characteristics of the Villa Rosa Regeneration Area and its surroundings make SPED policies TO1.2, UO1.1a, UO1.5 and UO1.6 which safeguard prime tourism sites, designate the Principal Urban Area (PUA) to accommodate major employment needs, guide new jobs to Business (tourism) Hubs and promote the attractiveness of these hubs to accommodate new jobs, key relevant strategic policies.
- 4.3 These policies which promote socio-economic development in the urban area, need to be balanced with policies TO8.2, TO8.4, TO8.7 and UO3.7 which safeguard protected areas, support the restoration of damaged ecosystems, control activities which might have an impact on areas, buildings and structures of ecological, geological and cultural heritage value and protect green open spaces which contribute towards the character and amenity of urban areas.
- 4.4 Furthermore, account must be taken of policies TO4.3, UO4.3, UO4.6 and UO4.7 which require improvement in the quality and quantity of utilities infrastructure, design of buildings and infrastructure to make efficient use of energy and resources and reduce waste, the integration of sustainable urban drainage systems and the requirements of people with special needs in the design of buildings.

North Harbours Local Plan (Paceville) 2006

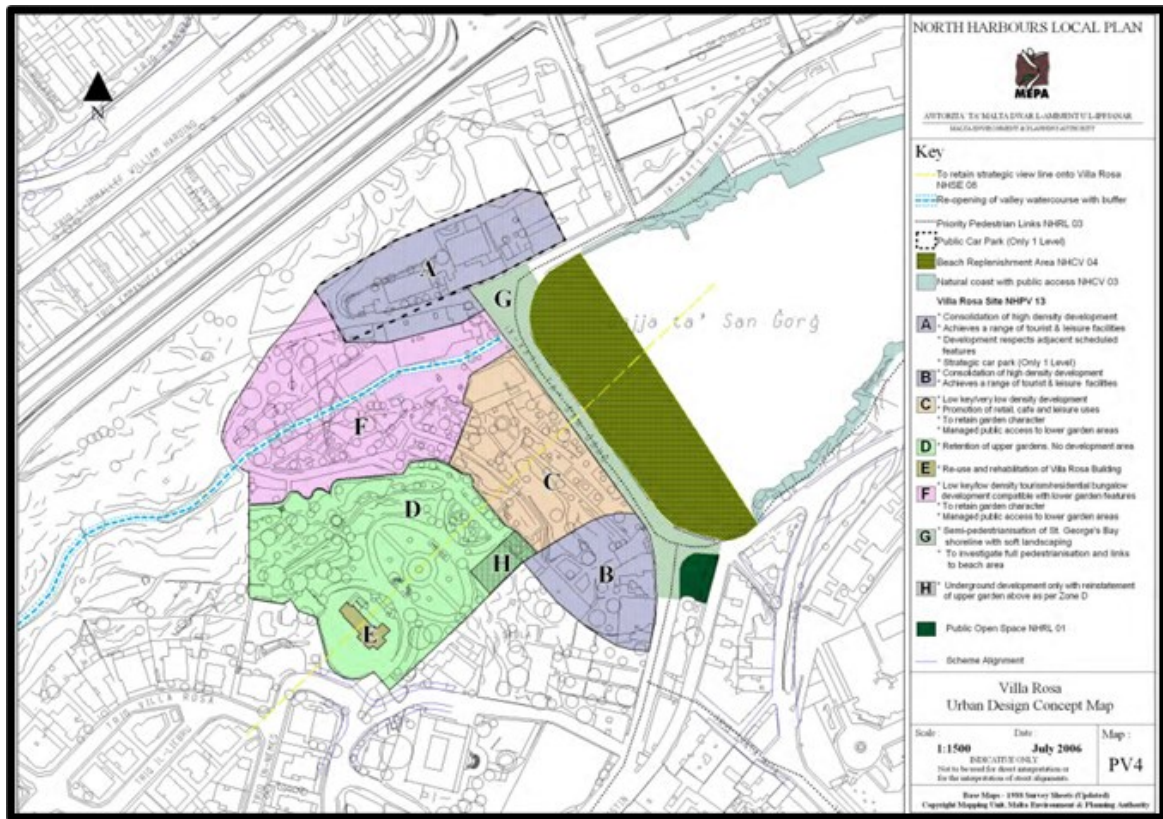


Figure 3: Villa Rosa Urban Design Concept Map PV4, July 2006

- 4.5 Policy NHPV13 and its associated Urban Design Concept Map PV4 (refer to Figure 3) in the approved North Harbours Local Plan of 2006, set out comprehensive development

parameters which organised the site into eight sub-zones. The policy and map safeguarded the villa and its immediate garden settings (Zones D, E and H), permitted high density tourism accommodation in two zones (A and B), low density residential/tourism bungalows in one zone along the valley (Zone F) and low-density retail development in the zone along the bay frontage (Zone C).

- 4.6 Policies NHTR14, NHPV01, NHPV03, NHPV07 and NHPV09 are linked to policy NHPV13 in relation to the proposed public carpark, leisure uses in Zone C and environmental improvements on the open area fronting the bay. Other relevant policies are NHSE07, NHSE08 and NHPV08 which relate to strategic views, local views and height envelopes.

Planning Policy on the Use and Applicability of the Floor Area Ratio (FAR) 2014

- 4.7 The objectives of this planning policy guidance are, amongst others, to define a tall building and indicate preferred uses and appropriate strategic locations for tall buildings. The policy defined a tall building as higher than 10 floors, included hotels in the list of

preferred uses for tall buildings and identified the locality of Paceville as an appropriate location for tall buildings with a preference for the tourism and entertainment zones designated in the Local Plan. Paceville's hotel and entertainment zones include the Villa Rosa site.

Height Limitation Adjustment Policy for Hotels 2014

- 4.8 The goal of this policy is to encourage the sustainable growth of the tourism sector in an ever-increasing competitive market. In the case of 3/4/5-star hotels, two additional floors over and above the number of floors permitted in the Local Plan could be considered under specified conditions. The allowable height of the hotel building could be more than two additional floors over and above the height limitation permitted in the Local Plan provided that the site area is not less than 5,000sqm or is surrounded by existing or planned roads or the site accommodates standalone buildings. Zones A and B allocated for high density development on the 2006 Villa Rosa Urban Design Concept Map PV4, July 2006 are larger than 5,000sqm, or have potential to accommodate a standalone building. Therefore, for these two zones, in principle, current policies set no capping on building heights, and consequently the gross developable floorspace.

5.0 Amended Local Plan Policies

- 5.1 Policy NHPV13 in this report shall replace the provisions of the 2006 policy NHPV13 – Villa Rosa and the provisions of 2006 policies NHTR14, NHPV01, NHPV03, NHPV07 and NHPV09, in so far as they relate to the Villa Rosa site as identified in Figure 2 of this report. The provisions of revised Villa Rosa Urban Design Concept Map PV4 in this report shall replace the Villa Rosa Urban Design Concept Map PV4 in the 2006 North Harbours Local Plan and shall also replace the provisions in the General Transport Strategy Map TR1, Paceville Policy Map PV1; Paceville Building Heights & Urban Design Map PV2; Area of Traffic Restraint Within Paceville Map PV3 in the 2006 North Harbours Local in so far as they relate to the Villa Rosa site as identified in Figure 2 of this report.
- 5.2 Policy NHPV 13 in the 2006 North Harbours Local Plan shall be replaced by the following:

NHPV13 – Villa Rosa Regeneration Area. From a location to a destination.

The Local Plan designates the land as indicated on policy Map PV4, as the Villa Rosa Regeneration Area for a high-quality tourism destination which shall be designed comprehensively by an integrated master plan approved through a single development

application, in accordance with the provisions of this policy. The Planning Authority may consider development applications which do not cover all the land area as indicated on policy Map PV4, provided the objective of achieving an integrated master plan is not compromised. Sites which are excluded from the integrated master plan shall remain regulated by all the provisions of this policy. The master plan shall also establish a development phasing programme.

The Development Strategy

The comprehensive master plan shall have the following general objectives:

1. To ensure that development is strictly located within the site boundaries shown on Map PV4.
2. To open the site shown on Map PV4 for public access and recreational use and ensure public access to the valley.
3. To protect the environmentally sensitive areas, buildings and features within the site shown on Map PV4, particularly the Grade 1 Villa Rosa, the Level 1 Harq Hammiem Cave and its buffer.
4. To ensure that development does not create unacceptable impacts on the environmentally sensitive areas, buildings and features surrounding the site shown on Map PV4, particularly the military Guardroom, the Level 1 Harq Hammiem Cave and its buffer, and the Level 1 Wied Harq Hammiem Area of Ecological Importance and its buffer.
5. To ensure that development does not create unacceptable impacts on the valley, St. George's Bay sunbathing and swimming area.
6. To adopt high standards of architectural quality and environmental sustainability in the design of buildings and open spaces, including low energy techniques, heat recovery systems, second class water recycling facilities, waste management and recycling schemes, run off reduction and collection measures, use of RES, passive measures such as natural ventilation, and integration of green/blue infrastructure and to promote designs that ensure that any resultant shadows are moving and temporary.
7. To ensure that the total Gross Developable Floorspace, as defined under A8 below, on all levels of the development, does not exceed the floorspaces established by this policy.
8. To determine all utilities infrastructure upgrading requirements to support the regeneration of the Villa Rosa site, including transport infrastructure both private and public, through the appropriate Infrastructure Impact Assessments, Traffic Impact Assessments and adopt specific mitigation measures or make monetary contributions towards their implementation.
9. To identify potential unacceptable impacts on the surrounding community through a Social Impact Assessment and adopt specific mitigation measures or make monetary contributions towards their implementation.

These general objectives shall be achieved through the implementation of the following policies.

A. Detailed Requirements:

The comprehensive master plan shall comply with the provisions of policy Map PV4, and with the provisions of the Development Framework Summary Table of this policy. For the purpose of the Development Framework Summary Table, the following provisions shall apply:

1. "Other" permissible land uses shall include uses which are deemed compatible, by the Planning Authority, with the primary land uses identified for each zone, excluding the land uses which are identified as primary uses to be located in another zone by the Development Framework.
2. Without prejudice to the provisions of this policy for the zones designated for open spaces or for public use in Zones B, C, D, F, G, and J, all current road and building alignments within the site boundary established in policy Map PV4 are repealed by this policy. The comprehensive master plan shall establish the precise building and road alignments within the site boundary established in policy Map PV4. The master plan may include minor re-alignments of the boundaries of the zones A1, A2, A3, A4, C and H as delineated on map PV4 and re-allocate the allowable GDF for each of these zones as established by the Development Framework Summary Table provided the total GDF is not increased.
3. In building zones A1, A2, A3, the application of the Height Limitation Adjustment Policy for Hotels 2014 is permissible and the footprint of the building which shall accommodate the higher quality hotel shall be clearly distinguished from any other buildings on the land within the same zone.
4. The maximum allowable building heights in floors, overall height in metres and the total number of levels in building Zones A1, A2, A3, A4, C and H, measured from the highest pavement level along the frontage of the building and subject to the additional provisions in the Development Framework Summary Table, shall be as set out in the applicable building heights table in this policy.
5. The building height limitations for each building zone shall not be exceeded except only through the application of the Height Limitation Adjustment Policy for Hotels 2014 on zones A1, A2 and A3. The additional floor allowed by Policy NHTO01 shall not be applicable to the Villa Rosa Regeneration Area.
6. Additional open spaces (public/private) within the building zones A1, A2, A3, A4, C (above the 1,275sqm public open space required by the Development Framework Summary Table) and H will be encouraged. Green roofs on zone H are compulsory and their design shall integrate well with the gardens on zone D and shall serve as an extension of this private open space.

7. The provisions of the Height Limitation Adjustment Policy for Hotels 2014, regarding “Relationship to context, historic environment, built form and skyline”, “Architectural Detailed Design”, “Information to accompany applications”, and “Legal Agreement” shall continue to apply for hotel buildings on zones A1, A2 and A3 higher than the height limitation permitted by the applicable building heights table in this policy. For hotel buildings on the same three zones higher than 42m, the “Obstacle Limitation Surface” and other navigation constraints shall not be infringed, the siting and design shall consider the effects on the microclimate, seek to reduce (i) overshadowing of public spaces, (ii) diversion of high windspeeds to ground level, (iii) heat islands and (iv) glare, and must be lit at night by well-designed lighting which avoids light pollution.
8. For the purpose of this policy, Gross Developable Floorspace (GDF) is the total area, which is internal and/or roofed over, including wall thickness (or in the case of party walls measured up to half the width of such walls) and also includes internal, completely enclosed, unroofed spaces. Balconies, terraces, parking and utilities’ service areas are excluded from the maximum allowable GDF.

B. Protected Area for ecological rehabilitation

Zone B as shown on policy Map PV4 is safeguarded from development and shall never be less than 2,570sqm. An ecological restoration method statement shall be submitted detailing how the ecological status of the site shall be improved and maintained to the satisfaction of ERA and shall, in particular address:

- i. restoration of the natural valley watercourse, extending onto Zone F, for a more holistic and effective environmental improvement
- ii. the species used, and planting layouts should emulate the natural vegetation of the surrounding area. Moreover, a native stock of saplings is to be used, and
- iii. inclusion of additional measures required for minimisation of impacts associated with the envisaged physical works.

The development phasing programme in the comprehensive masterplan shall identify the early timing and maximum duration for this ecological restoration initiative.

C. Retention of Upper Gardens

In Zone D as shown on policy Map PV4:

- i. The rehabilitation and conservation of the existing upper gardens is required; and
- ii. No physical interventions will be considered in this no development zone other than those required under (i) above, which may include development beneath existing terraces or hard surfaces as part of the conservation scheme of the existing upper gardens.

D. Viable Re-use of Villa Rosa

In Zone E as shown on policy Map PV4:

- i. A full rehabilitation programme, including appropriate minor internal/external alterations that are necessary to accommodate the new use for Villa Rosa, will be sought provided that the architectural integrity of the Villa is fully respected
- ii. All proposals should respect the historic and architectural detailing of the Villa in accordance with the scheduled status of the building and its prominent location. Any development is to safeguard the strategic view line onto Villa Rosa as indicated on policy Map PV4.

E. Public Open Space

Zone F as shown on policy Map PV4 is designated for public use and shall never be less than 3,830sqm. This public space shall be landscaped and open, and no structure shall exceed 1.5m from the level of Zone G provided that this difference in level is required to create interest in the design of the layout of the public space. It shall be directly accessible from Zone G and linked to the public space on Zone C. Excavations below this zone shall only be allowed for underground car parks, servicing areas and proper vehicular circulation without prejudice to requirement of B(i) above. Bridging over the public space by buildings to connect Zone A1 with Zone A3 may be considered favourably provided the openness of Zone F and local views from the bay towards the valley are not compromised, the design of the resulting building is of an exceptional quality and the maximum GDF for Zones A1 and A3 in the Development Framework Summary Table are not exceeded. The footprint of the bridged over area shall not exceed 20% of the footprint of this Zone and may consist of buildings which shall be used as the buildings forming part of Zone A1 and Zone A3. Commercialisation of this Zone F shall not be permitted.

F. Pedestrianisation of Bay Shoreline

In Zone G as shown on policy Map PV4:

- i. As part of the comprehensive development proposal for the Villa Rosa Regeneration Area, proposals for the management of traffic on the road space marked under Zone G

which may include the full or semi pedestrianisation of Zone G for public outdoor use shall be included.

ii. The physical re-design of Zone G should include suitable materials, and proposals should include details of street furniture, paving and other materials.

15.4.26 The 3.82ha Villa Rosa Regeneration Area is located on the northern most periphery of the SPED Principal Urban Area along the urban coast of Paceville, Malta's prime tourist and entertainment hub. The site takes its name from the Grade 1 scheduled building known as the Villa Rosa and its grounds, designed by Maltese architect Andrea Vassallo in the 1920s as a house in the Art Nouveau style. The house sits on elevated ground surrounded by mature gardens and is a local landmark overlooking the highly popular St. George's Bay, offering an open, green context to the surrounding built environment to the south dominated by higher buildings of contemporary design.

15.4.26a The Regeneration Area is currently organised into three main character areas – the listed building and its gardens, tourism accommodation, bars and restaurants, pool and sports facilities along the beach frontage, and a distinct built-up area to the north of the site also accommodating tourism related uses. Buildings are mostly three floors. Direct access to the Regeneration Area is from the often congested ix-Xatt ta' San Gorg which links to the TEN-T arterial road network from Triq Santu Wistin and from Triq il-Professur Walter Gando. A secondary access point is from Triq in-Nemes in Swieqi.

15.4.26b Villa Rosa lies on the edge of Paceville and is contiguous to high density tourism and entertainment uses to the south and northeast, including the major mixed-use development project of the x-ITS site, in sharp contrast with the Harq Hammiem Valley along the immediate northern perimeter and the low-density housing areas further north and to the southwest. Another distinguishing feature is the Harq Hammiem Cave extending beneath a small part of the site to the northeast.

15.4.26c Since the original policy proposals as consolidated in the approved local plan of 2006, and the approval of numerous developments in the immediate and wider surroundings of the site, the strategic aims for the redevelopment of this site have been evolving over time. An opportunity exists to revise the development planning policy framework to better reflect Government's strategic objectives of strengthening the environmental regulatory safeguards, improve the ecological and geological status of the features of conservation value, open the site for public enjoyment by providing more green open spaces and encouraging the diversion of private sector investment in the tourism and leisure industry towards a higher quality.

15.4.26d This revised policy framework seeks to upgrade the quality of tourism development whilst ensuring that the distinguishing characteristics which make the site a unique urban place are safeguarded for future users and visitors. Primarily it establishes clear limits to development in terms of built footprint, height of buildings and densities (GDF). No less than 5,100sqm of public open space and 11,60sqm of private open space integrated in the scheme, together with the upgrading of the public beach shoreline shall be the driver of the new design vision. An equally important element of the new design vision being promoted by this policy is the inclusion in the project of iconic tall buildings exclusively for up-market, high quality hotel use which can be achieved through the application of the Height Limitation Adjustment Policy for Hotels. The tall hotel buildings shall strongly contribute to the uniqueness of this high-quality tourism destination and shall complement the other tall buildings already permitted, and being constructed, to achieve the strategic planning objective of establishing a cluster of tall buildings in Paceville with a distinctive skyline.

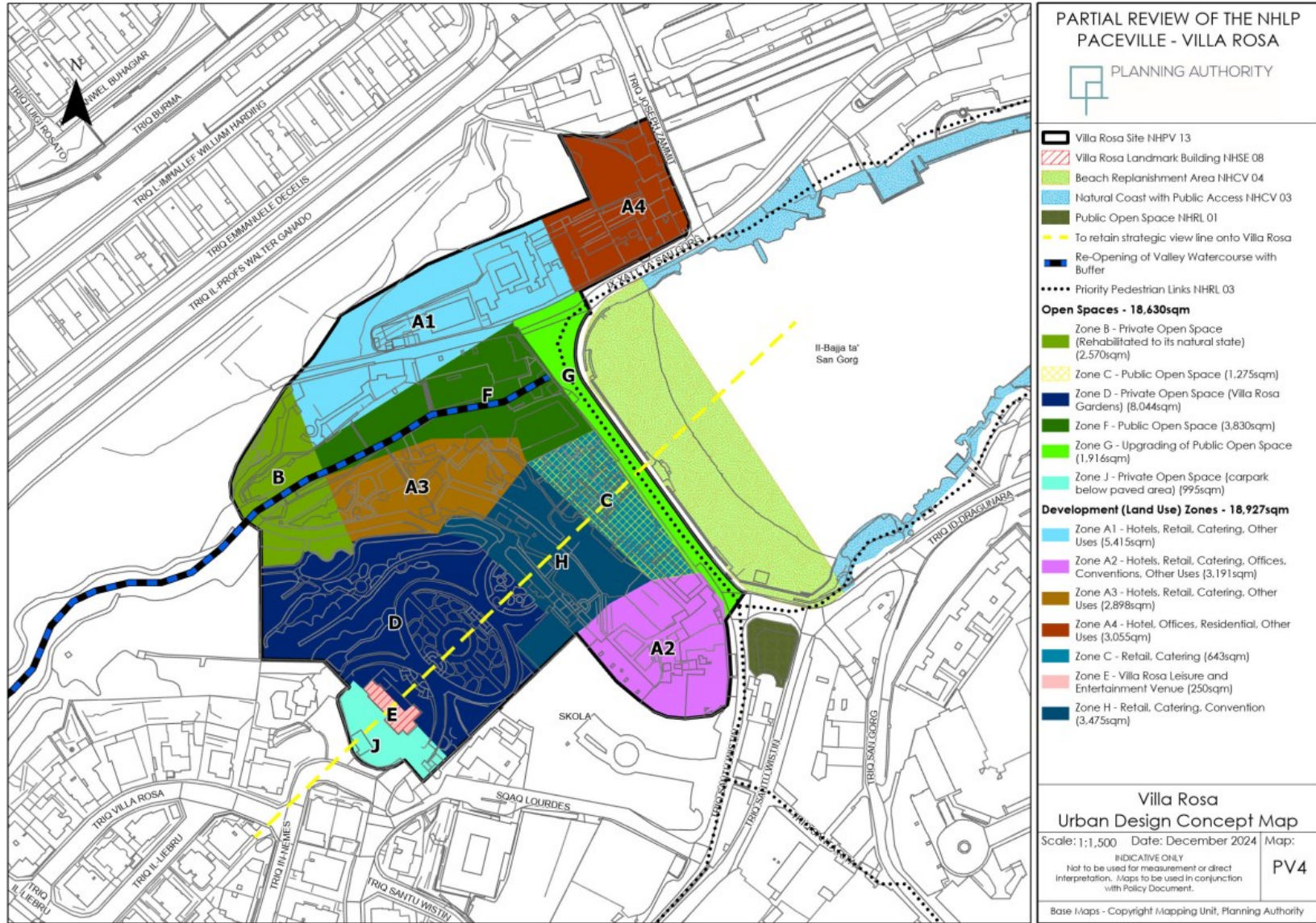
6.0 Way Forward

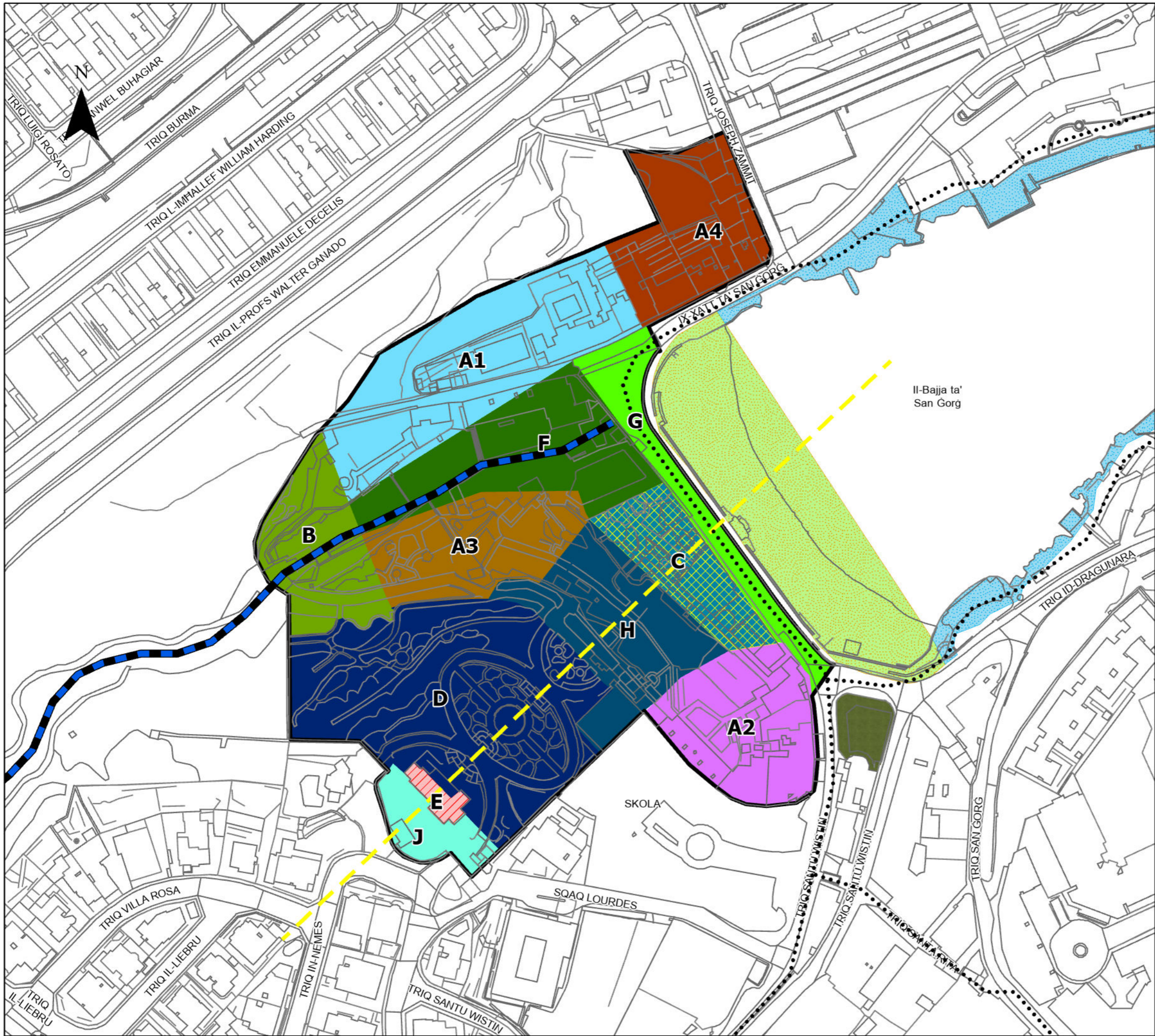

This would also indicate why this exercise (if requested by an individual) was undertaken by the government/PA when the individual requesting the modification of the Local Plan could have followed the Planning Control application procedure of Article 54 of Chapter 552¹ of the Laws of Malta with the payment of the relative fees. Why has the Planning Authority taken up this particular request for Local Plan Review whilst denying others – for the reversal of the rationalization exercise of 2006 in some areas for example?

Lack of access to studies, reports, presentations regarding this Local Plan Review

It is being highlighted that the public is entirely in the dark as to the need for this Local Plan Review. There have been no published studies or reports indicating that there is a dearth of tourists in Malta, or that high rise buildings are the only hotels which can accommodate high quality tourists. There is no guarantee that building more high rises will make Malta a unique destination. Rather – all available information indicates otherwise.

In view of this, the public is entitled to information justifying this Local Plan Review. In comments to Maltatoday², the Prime Minister stated that PA officials gave a presentation to Cabinet about this Partial Plan Review. It is not understood why the same presentation/information cannot be given to the public as well. To be perfectly clear, this is not a request to be given access to confidential Cabinet discussions by members of Cabinet but a request for Planning Authority

Following the first phase consultation on the objectives, the draft policy has been issued for consultation which shall include a public sitting of the Parliamentary Standing Committee during which detailed presentations and replies to any queries raised are normally provided.



officials to inform the public as to the justification of this Partial Plan Review and any studies or reports supporting it.

As it is, it is difficult to understand why the Planning Authority is undertaking this particular Local Plan Review.

Lack of sufficient justification for this Local Plan Review

There is insufficient justification for this Local Plan Review. A specific policy for the Villa Rosa already exists and is incorporated in the present Local Plan. It already makes provision for the different areas within the site and their respective planning designation and density. The safeguarding of scheduled sites and areas of ecological value is also already provided for. In view of this it cannot be understood which parameters, the Planning Authority intends to change and to what end. Presumably this Local Plan Review is intended to accommodate and ensure the approval of the development planning application which has already been filed – enabling height increases which will overshadow the beach or other areas and introducing a greater number of hotel beds at a time when the country is already straining at the seams because of over-tourism.

The Carrying Capacity Study for Tourism in the Maltese Islands³ 04 July 2022 by Deloitte notes that the increase in bed-stock and population growth (which this Local Plan Review seeks to achieve) will have deleterious effects on the country's environment and "Achieving growth via rapid expansionary measures, such as is implied by the estimated growth in the supply of bed-stock, together with the implied population growth, appears to run contrary to the direction implied by sustainability targets and such a strategy will increase the effort and investment required to achieve targets."

The usual justification of this by the Planning Authority is that there will be infrastructural improvements which will mitigate the impacts of intensification of development, but as experience has shown us, infrastructural changes have not solved problems arising from over-capacity. Moreover, increased infrastructure brings about its own environmental problems. As is evident from this proposed Local Plan Review there is no will to slow down this mad rush to further environmental chaos.

1. Background

The Planning Authority has commenced a partial review of the 2006 North Harbours Local Plan for the Paceville area, limited specifically to the Villa Rosa site as delineated by the 2006 local plan.

Clarification required as to the contribution which developer will be making for required infrastructural upgrades

Despite the ostensible reason of this Local Plan Review exercise being that of clarification, it does not clarify one crucial factor – who is going to pay for the infrastructural works which will inevitably be required to accommodate this intensification of use? Will it be the taxpayer or the developer of the site? In order for there to be full transparency on this issue, the infrastructural works needed on a relevant (and not overtly limited) Area of Influence has to be indicated, and the costs and the environmental suitability of such works established beforehand. If this is not done at this stage, we will have the usual situation whereby infrastructural works are fragmented with the public not being given the full picture whilst also bearing the costs to support speculative development.

It is being highlighted that in the note to⁴ the existing Local Plan Policy NHPV 13 states that "the Villa Rosa area is likely to be subject to intensification of tourist uses and the redevelopment of the

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existing hotel" and that "MEPA will expect the development to make a tangible contribution to the traffic management strategy outlined by Area Policies NHPV01 and 3." In view of the fact that this Partial Local Plan Review will result in even further intensification than that of the original Local Plan, the PA is duty bound to quantify developer's financial contribution at this point, and not to hide behind vague wording.

Further clarification required.

Meaningful representations may only be made when further clarifications and detailed plans are published as the "devil is in the detail" which the public must scrutinise.

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1. PARTIAL REVIEW OF THE 2006 NORTH HARBOUR LOCAL PLAN FOR PACEVILLE (VILLA ROSA SITE).

With respect to the consultation objectives relating to the partial review of the 2006 North Harbour Local Plan for Paceville (Villa Rosa site), I would like to draw the attention of the Authority to important facts which have emerged from various articles appearing in the media on this subject. In particular, I refer to the following three articles:

- *Public consultation on Villa Rosa project 'a barefaced lie'* – published on theshiftnews.com on Friday 18 October 2024. Copy in **APPENDIX 1**
- *Revealed: The Villa Rosa plans presented to Cabinet* – published on timesofmalta.com on Sunday 20 October 2024. Copy in **APPENDIX 2**
- *How the Villa Rosa Local Plan review mirrors the developers' presentation* – published on timesofmalta.com on Sunday 20 October 2024. Copy in **APPENDIX 3**

In the article from theshiftnews.com, it is stated that:

"The environmental NGO Graffiti! ... is claiming ... collusion between government and developer Tal-Francix regarding the Villa Rosa in St George's Bay.

The NGO said the government's real intention had been revealed through a discrepancy in a Planning Authority application that has been submitted.

Earlier this week, the Authority published a report to initiate a review of the area's local plan. The Shift revealed earlier this month that efforts were being made to change the local plan to accommodate the project.

While the document states it is proposing a review of Villa Rosa, the new document also includes the area encompassed by Planning Authority application 7254/22, which is the area of the Tal-Francix application.

This application is for three towers, ranging from 27 to 34 storeys, which will bury St George's Bay, engulf the historic Villa Rosa building and remove the only open area between St Julian's and Pembroke.

This shows that the government is ready to change the law to help out a developer, the NGO said. "The prime minister's announcement of a public consultation is thus a bare-faced lie since it is clear the only intention is to help out a developer."

The alleged collusion described above is further strengthened by the content of the two articles from timesofmalta.com.

The first of the two articles from timesofmalta.com, namely the one titled *Revealed: The Villa Rosa plans presented to Cabinet*, reveals that a presentation about the proposed Villa Rosa development which would sit on the site about which public consultation is taking place had been made by the developers or their representatives to the Cabinet of Ministers.

There has been no denial by the Cabinet about the developer's presentation.

The Partial Review is following the provisions of the Development Planning Act.

The second of the two articles from timesofmalta.com, namely the one titled *How the Villa Rosa Local Plan review mirrors the developers' presentation*, makes abundantly clear that the consultation objectives published by the Authority have been derived from a developer's presentation which was delivered to the Cabinet. The article states as follows:

"A six-point plan to change St George's Bay's Villa Rosa local plan published by the Planning Authority on Tuesday was lifted almost word-for-word from a list of suggestions drafted by the project's developers and later presented to Cabinet.

In a presentation drafted by the project's developers (AC Group) and architects (Dutch architecture firm UNStudio), Cabinet was presented with a list of six "objectives" for the review of the area's local plan.

These included reconfiguring zoning boundaries, establishing "allowable building heights for each sub-zone", and setting the "maximum gross Developable floorspace", among other things.

Each of these suggestions was reproduced almost verbatim by the Planning Authority when launching a public consultation into the review on Tuesday."

The article then shows a tabulation with a side-by-side comparison of the objectives per the developers' presentation and the Authority's consultation objectives.

The contents of the article are credible.

But the denials by the developer and the government are not credible.

Therefore, in my view, there is enough evidence to show that the public consultation process, specifically that related to the consultation objectives of the partial review of the 2006 North Harbour Local Plan for Paceville (Villa Rosa site), is vitiated because the consultation objectives are effectively *di parte* (biased), because they are of the developer of the Villa Rosa site, and that as a consequence, this public consultation is about the developer's objectives for the Villa Rosa site, and therefore the public consultation process is a sham, and that anything that comes out of it, including any draft of the partial review of the 2006 North Harbour Local Plan for Paceville (Villa Rosa site), should be deemed null and void. I invoke, *inter-alia*, the legal principle that *quod nullum est, nullum prodeit effectum*.

I am actually extremely surprised that following the above revelations in the media, neither the Prime Minister, nor the Authority, have deemed it right to cancel the public consultation process and send it back to the drawing board. In my view, the public consultation should have been cancelled at once.

Therefore, at this point, I will limit my representations about the public consultation and the consultation objectives for the partial review of the 2006 North Harbour Local Plan for Paceville (Villa Rosa site) to the above observations, and will not add any further representations about this public consultation, whilst I reserve all my legal rights with respect to its outcome.

BirdLife Malta Feedback on the Partial Review of the 2006 North Harbours Local Plan for Paceville (Villa Rosa Site)

In view of the public consultation process for the published Partial Review of the 2006 North Harbours Local Plan for Paceville (Villa Rosa Site), BirdLife Malta would like to provide the below feedback:

Lack of transparency on the justification for this Local Plan Review

Although the Planning Authority (PA) outlines objectives for this Local Plan Review, it does not clearly explain the reasons behind it or why the existing 2006 Local Plans are no longer adequate. A review should ideally address specific gaps or meet particular needs, but in this case, it remains unclear what gaps or needs are being targeted. This makes it difficult to understand the rationale for the Planning Authority's decision to proceed with this Local Plan Review.

The usual justification of this by the Planning Authority is that there will be infrastructural improvements which will mitigate the impacts of intensification of development, but as experience has shown us, infrastructural changes have not solved problems arising from over-capacity. Moreover, increased infrastructure brings about its own environmental problems. As is evident from this proposed Local Plan Review there is no will to slow down this mad rush to further environmental chaos.

Lack of transparency on the request for this Local Plan Review

The Prime Minister has stated that a request was made – however who requested it and why, remains unclear. This request should be published, and the full extent of the request should be made clear to the public.

This would also indicate why this exercise (if requested by an individual) was undertaken by the government/PA when the individual requesting the modification of the Local Plan could have followed the Planning Control application procedure of Article 54 of Chapter of the Laws of Malta with the payment of the relative fees.

Lack of information on the re-configuration

A specific policy for the Villa Rosa area already exists within the current Local Plan. The proposed review states that the sub-zones designated in the original 2006 Local Plan area will be reconfigured. However, the map provided only outlines the boundary of the Villa

This partial review is following the procedural requirements of the Development Planning Act.

The revised boundary included with the published objectives forms part of the partial review and was the



Rosa area without detailing the proposed reconfiguration. Without seeing the actual changes, the public cannot accurately assess how this reconfiguration might impact surrounding areas and quality of life, rendering this public consultation largely ineffective from the community's perspective. Meaningful public input can only occur once further clarifications and detailed plans are made available.

A specific policy for the Villa Rosa already exists and is incorporated in the present Local Plan. The proposed review states that the sub-zones identified within the original Local Plan area of 2006 will be re-configured. Nonetheless, the map presented only delineates the boundary of the Villa Rosa area without specifying the proposed re-configuration. Without presenting the actual reconfiguration, the public cannot form an accurate judgment of how the proposed reconfiguration will impact the surrounding areas and their livelihood. Therefore, this public consultation is ultimately a futile exercise from the public's standpoint. Meaningful representations from the public may only be made when further clarifications and detailed plans are published.

The current Local Plans for Villa Rosa already makes provision for the different areas within the site and their respective planning designation and density. The safeguarding of scheduled sites and areas of ecological value is also already provided for. In view of this it cannot be understood which parameters, the Planning Authority intends to change and to what end. It is quite clear, that this Local Plan Review is intended to accommodate and ensure the approval of the development planning application which has already been filed – enabling height increases which will overshadow the beach or other areas and introducing a greater number of hotel beds at a time when the country is already suffering the repercussions of over-tourism.

Increase in the site area to be regulated by this Local Plan Review

In the background to this Partial Review of the 2006 North Harbours Local Plan for Paceville (Villa Rosa Site), it is stated that, "The Planning Authority has commenced a partial review of the 2006 North Harbours Local Plan for the Paceville area, **limited specifically to the Villa Rosa site as delineated by the 2006 local plan.**" However, there is a difference between the Villa Rosa site as delineated by the 2006 local plan and the Villa Rosa Boundary Map accompanying this Local Plan Review. The latter is larger than the Villa Rosa site as delineated by the 2006 North Harbours Local Plan as it extends to Moynihan House across the road from the City Centre site. Consequently, the statement issued by the Planning Authority that this partial review is "**limited specifically to the Villa Rosa site as delineated by the 2006 local plan**" is wrong and misleading.

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Lack of definition of "higher quality hotels"

The Review document states that one of its objectives is to determine "c. zones where higher quality hotels shall be allowed". This seems to be implying that "higher quality hotels" (as opposed to the other lower quality ones?) will be allowed to be sited in prime spots, possibly obstructing views of Villa Rosa, and/or shadowing the valley and/or the beach. There should be no preferential treatment for hotels if their siting impinges upon residential amenity or scenic or environmentally-sensitive sites.

Concluding remark

In light of the lack of clarity in the submissions made to date, we object to the proposed amendments to local plans to accommodate the developers of the Villa Rosa area and insist that these issues be addressed comprehensively before any further progress is made.

The revised development planning policies for hotels were proposed in 2012 and adopted in 2014. The revised local plan policy mandates the protection of the view line of the Villa Rosa from the Bay and addresses shadowing on the valley and bay. Hotels which impinge on residential amenity, or scenic or environmentally sensitive areas are not permitted by policy.

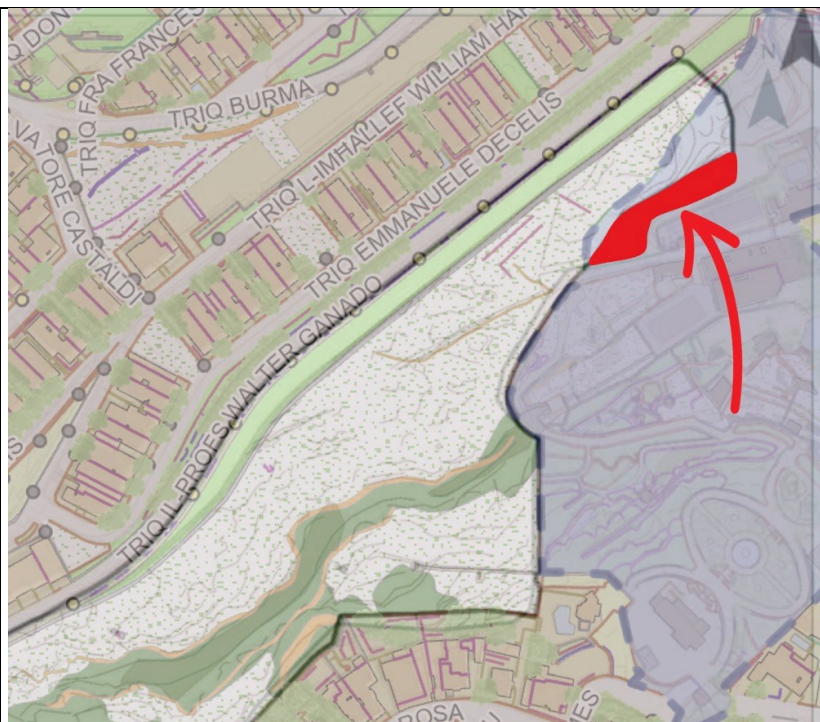
